



El sacerdocio eterno de Jesús

En Hebreos, aprendemos acerca del papel de Jesús como nuestro sumo sacerdote eterno. A diferencia de los sacerdotes del antiguo pacto, que eran muchos y temporales, el sacerdocio de Jesús es perfecto y eterno. Él se ofrece a sí mismo como el sacrificio perfecto por nuestros pecados, de una vez por todas. El sacerdocio eterno de Jesús nos muestra su profundo y fiel amor por nosotros. Él intercede continuamente por nosotros, siendo siempre nuestro abogado ante Dios. Este papel inmutable y firme de Jesús nos asegura su cuidado y apoyo constantes. Nuestra respuesta al sacerdocio eterno de Jesús debe ser de gratitud y fidelidad. Estamos llamados a confiar en su obra continua en nuestras vidas y a seguir su ejemplo de amor sacrificial. Al reconocer su sacerdocio eterno, profundizamos nuestra comprensión de su amor y compromiso con nosotros.

Las lecturas del 31.^º Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario, Año B, nos recuerdan la importancia del amor, la lealtad y la fidelidad. Vemos estos temas en los mandamientos dados en Deuteronomio, el sacerdocio eterno de Jesús en Hebreos y los mandamientos más grandes enseñados por Jesús en Marcos. Esforcémonos por vivir este amor en nuestras vidas, construyendo el Reino de Dios a través de nuestras acciones fieles.



Jesus' Eternal Priesthood

In Hebrews, we learn about Jesus' role as our eternal high priest. Unlike the priests of the old covenant who were many and temporary, Jesus' priesthood is perfect and eternal. He offers Himself as the perfect sacrifice for our sins, once and for all. Jesus' eternal priesthood shows us His deep and faithful love for us. He continually intercedes for us, always remaining our advocate before God. This unchanging and steadfast role of Jesus reassures us of His constant care and support. Our response to Jesus' eternal priesthood should be one of gratitude and faithfulness. We are called to trust in His ongoing work in our lives and to follow His example of sacrificial love. By acknowledging His eternal priesthood, we deepen our understanding of His love and commitment to us.

The readings for the 31st Sunday in Ordinary Time Year B remind us of the importance of love, loyalty, and faithfulness. We see these themes in the commandments given in Deuteronomy, the eternal priesthood of Jesus in Hebrews, and the greatest commandments taught by Jesus in Mark. Let us strive to live out this love in our lives, building up the Kingdom of God through our faithful actions

Qué tristeza es ver que muchos viven conforme al mundo y de manera contraria a la Ley de Dios, y sin cambiar de actitudes ni confesarse van a recibir a Dios vivo presente en la hostia sin el menor discernimiento de lo que hacen, sólo por el qué dirán los demás y sin pensar en lo que Dios sí dice de esto. Es el lamentable "modernismo" que los ha impregnado, es la inconsciencia de lo que es recibir a Dios, es el permanecer en sus errores y en su vida de pecado, creyendo en un falso dios bonachón hecho a su gusto, medida y conveniencia.

Resulta contrastante ver tantos comulgantes y vacíos los confesionarios. ¿En verdad todos ellos estarán en gracia y no requerirán confesarse? Sin intentar penetrar en la conciencia de alguien en particular, las matemáticas parecen que no cuadran, una multitud que comulga y los confesionarios....vacíos!.

Todo ello, lleva a la sacrílega comunión en pecado grave y sin confesión sacramental, que los hace comer y beber su propia condenación.

Saint Paul, divinely inspired, says that whoever takes Communion in mortal sin "eats and drinks his own condemnation."


Therefore the need for our soul to be cleansed of all mortal sin so that Christ can be received by us. Therefore the need for sacramental confession for all those who know they are in grave sin. Receiving the Body and Blood of Christ in Communion without being forgiven by sacramental confession is a very serious sin called sacrilege. How sad it is to see that many live according to the world and in a way contrary to the Law of God, and without changing their attitudes or confessing, they go to receive the living God present in the host without the slightest discernment of what they do, only because of what others will say and without thinking about what God does say about this. It is the lamentable "modernism" that has permeated them, it is the unconsciousness of what it is to receive God, it is the persistence in their errors and in

their life of sin, believing in a false good-natured god made to their taste, measure and convenience. It is contrasting to see so many communicants and empty confessionalists. Are they really all in grace and do not need to confess? Without trying to penetrate the conscience of someone in particular, the mathematics do not seem to add up, a multitude that takes communion and the confessionalists... empty!.

All this leads to sacrilegious communion in grave sin and without sacramental confession, which makes them eat and drink their own condemnation.
